

The Apple Orchard

Adjacent to Bruksstaden's lowest point lies a rare and valuable space - identified in this proposal as one of the site's green catalysts. To enhance its potential, the proposed Orchard Park is designed as a green corridor, linking the site to the larger park system of eastern Eslöv. Open-air stormwater management is introduced as a context-sensitive and future-oriented solution for the development of Bruksstaden.

The Sports Facilities and Primary School
A smart way to meet the industrial development to
the north - while maintaining vibrant community life
- is to integrate a city-wide sports facility and
swimming hall. To increase density, a primary school
is placed above the sports center, making use of its
green roof as a shared courtyard.



Block Mörten - north housing Inspired by Eslöv's paradox - the industrial city among castles - the blocks are organized using geometric elements borrowed from both medieval architecture and industrial rationalism.

The Wooden Canopy
Connecting Östergatan and Bruksstaden, the
Wooden Canopy is a semi-open pathway that
invites residents and visitors to move through, meet,
and take shelter throughout the year. It is designed
using parametric tools that respond to both the
intented playful architectural form and the need to
adapt to the existing topographic lines.



The Central Square
The heart of the *Bricks and Blossoms* proposal lies here, at the Central Square - a meeting point of crossroads where people pass through or gather for open-air events, or to witness the weekly journey of the freight train. This generous space invites eastern and western Eslöv to continue growing together.



Block Mörten - south housing
The eastern block of Bruksstaden contains
approximately 70% of the new housing development.
The design is structured to create an urban front toward
Östergatan, minimizing noise pollution. Solar panels are
used to minimize energy consumption and shared
greenhouses offer the possibility to cultivate food.
